2.3.2. Decision Response

We will send our decision within 6 weeks.

2.3.3. Transcripts of Records

A Transcript of Records will be issued no later than 5 to 6 weeks after the assessment period has finished at our institution.

2.3.4. Termination of the agreement

It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."
