- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks.
- A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

Either party can terminate the agreement by informing the other party expressly in writing. In case of a unilateral termination of the agreement, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Students selected prior the date of notification must be admitted by the receiving institution. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of conflict.

University of Finance and Management in Bialystok: International students are advised to purchase health insurance in the home country, before departure. NON-EU Student can benefit from the health services but medical consultation is paid (the health insurance company can then reimburse the cost; student is advised to confirm with their insurance company exactly what level of medical coverage they are entitled to in Poland and what are the reimbursement procedures). International students can purchase the insurance in Poland by agreement with National Fund of Health or private insurance company.

University of Finance and Management in Bialystok: Non-EU citizens need to obtain a visa prior departure from their home country.
