There are, however, a number of countries that are free of this requirement. If student is a citizen of an EU member state, to enter Poland she/he will need a valid travel document or a document confirming identity and citizenship (i.e. your national ID). As UE citizens student should only apply for registration of their stay with local voivodship office within 90 days of their arrival. They will be issued a cost-free certificate of registration with non-
